A Message from Pastor Mike:

"You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul,... teach them to your children, talking about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when your rise."

- Deuteronomy 11:18a, 19

"How is your faith?"

- President George W. Bush

"How is your faith?" It's a question President George W. Bush famously asked at Bible studies and prayer breakfasts. David Gregory, a Sunday morning political pundit, was also asked that question not long before he lost his TV job. Whether it was the president's question or his employment crisis, the question got him thinking about his own faith, and he wrote a book by the same name.

How is your faith, today? Would you call it white hot and passionate? Would you call it vibrant? Or maybe it's full of questions. Or maybe you're wondering if God is even listening to your prayers. Or maybe, like one of the churches in Revelation, it's lukewarm. You're kind of going through the motions. Or maybe faith doesn't really come up in your Monday through Saturday life very much.

How is your faith today? An even more interesting and important question is, "What would you like your faith to be like in the future?" And if it's different than where you are today, how do you get from where you are to where you want to be in your faith?

I would hope we all desire a more vibrant, lifegiving faith that informs the choices and decisions we make every day and that carries us through our difficult times. I can't say I'm there very often. Can you?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10th. I can't think of a better time to work on our faith. It begins that evening with ashes, and hearing the bad news that none of us are getting out of here alive, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." It's kind of a kick in the head, but it helps me begin to reset my priorities. Most of what I think is important at any given moment doesn't really deserve to be.

You and I are dust. The good news on Ash Wednesday is, we are dust that our Lord loves. That's a good place to begin. We have 40 days to explore what it means to be dust that our Lord loves. 40 days to re-prioritize our lives and work on our faith. 40 days to get ready for a resurrection that explodes what it means to be dust.

The journey begins in the wilderness (Feb. 14). Jesus battles Satan and the temptations we all experience to do things our way rather than God's way. On Feb 21 we hear Jesus grieve over his rebellious people whom he would love to gather together like a hen gathers her chicks, but the people were not interested. Why would they ignore their Lord? On Feb. 28 we hear about the random tragedies that always shake us up, and find that deep relationship with our Lord is the only anchor that can hold us when the storms come. On March 6 Jesus tells the story of the extravagant love of the Father for both his prodigal sons. On March 13 we see a woman who experienced Jesus' love and is moved to extravagant thanks. Then comes Holy Week when we journey with Jesus to Jerusalem, a horrible cross, and a surprise that turns our grief to joy.

How is your faith today? What would you like your faith to be like in the future? This Lent, rather than give something up, let's join together in prayer, study, and conversation for 40 days of growing our faith.


Trinity has Holden Evening Prayer with skits/puppets as part of worship. We place strips of cloths-our sin on the cross.

TRINITY- ORVILLE OWENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP in AGRICULTURAL STUDIES APPLICATIONS are available on the Communication Corner at church (and one is included in this newsletter). There are a few changes for 2016.

- The \$1,000 TLC-Orville Owens Ag Scholarship is open to all students. Applications are due in the church office by March 18th.
- The Trinity Member Scholarship is now non-competitive, meaning all applicants who meet the criteria will receive a \$500 scholarship. Applications for the Trinity Member Scholarship will be available in April.

Completed TLC-Orville Owens Ag Scholarship applications, with letters of reference, are due in the church office by March 18th. Both the Ag and Trinity Member Scholarships will be awarded to students continuing their education at a 2 or 4 year college, university, or vocational school.

TRINITY-ORVILLE OWENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR AGRICULTURAL STUDIES 2016 APPLICATION

I. Who is eligible for this scholarship?

Any individual planning to continue their education at any four year, two year, or vocational school in a field related to agriculture (Forestry, Ag Sciences, Mechanics, etc).

II. How do I apply for this scholarship?

Complete the application on reverse side and return it, <u>along with two letters of reference</u> from non-relatives, to the Trinity Lutheran Church Office **by March 18, 2016**. At least one letter of reference should be from someone in the agricultural community.

III. How are recipients selected?

- A. Recipient will be chosen by Trinity's scholarship selection team from the applications that are submitted.
- B. If the selection team is not satisfied with the applications, the scholarship will not be awarded that year.

IV. How are recipients notified?

Recipients will be notified via telephone. Certificate to be awarded at a time and place to be determined.

V. How and when do recipients receive scholarship money?

A. Money will be awarded by Trinity Endowment Fund treasurer after recipient's successful completion of first semester of classes.

Recipient must submit proof of registration for the next semester classes and a copy of the first completed semester grades, grade average C or above. A check will then be issued to either the recipient or the school according to the recipient's choice.
