A Message from Pastor Mike:

"Thus says the Lord, ... 'Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing,"

- Isaiah 43:18-19a

"Why for God's sake does this congregation exist? Where in Jesus' name are we going? How by the power of the Holy Spirit will we get there?" - ELCA Bishop Mark Narum

Isaiah wrote to a people held captive in a far off land, a people who had no hope of ever being a country again. God said, "I am about to do a new thing" among you. The fact that Judah had been wiped off the map was no obstacle to God. Our Lord was on a mission to redeem God's people. And God did it.

I wonder if God is about to do a new thing in our place and time? Our Lord's mission is still to redeem the world. What role are we called to play in God's mission?

The next several months will be a time of prayer, study and conversation at Trinity as we work to discern the particular role our Lord is calling us to play in God's mission. We will ask ourselves, "Why in God's name does Trinity exist? Where for Jesus' sake are we going? How, by the power of the Holy Spirit, will we get there?"

As we discern Trinity's role in God's mission, it is equally vital to explore our individual roles in God's mission. I invite you to engage in a time of personal prayer and Bible study too. Ask, "Why in God's name do I exist? Where for Jesus sake am I going? How by the power of the Holy Spirit will I get there?" Where do you hear God leading you?

The whole congregation will gather for two important times of conversation and discernment this month. The first is the weekend of **April 22-24** when we will conduct a **Comprehensive Ministry Review**. A 5-person research team will meet with staff and community leaders on Friday, council members and leaders on Saturday, and the whole congregation during coffee fellowship on Sunday. They will ask lots of questions, but mostly they will be among us to listen. After the weekend they'll issue a report to the church council of affirmations - the things we are doing well, and recommendations - things we can work on. We will use their findings to help us discover what God is calling us to be and do here in Hammond.

On **Sunday, May 1st from 10:30-1:00** (after worship) Pastor John Sutherland will lead us in an **Asset Mapping workshop**. All Trinity members are invited to attend. We'll list our gifts on post-it notes and organize them on the walls of the room. We'll list the needs of our community on post-it notes and organize them on the walls. Then we'll look for places that our God-given gifts intersect with the needs of our community. Those intersections will begin to reveal and name the parts of God's mission we are uniquely called and suited to perform.

Our Lord's mission is to redeem the world. Come April 22-24 and May 1st. Help us discover the particular role Trinity is being called to play in God's mission.

III. How are recipients selected?

- A. Recipient(s) will be chosen by the scholarship selection team from the applications that are submitted.
- B. This is a non-competitive scholarship. All applicants who meet the Scholarship Criteria will receive a scholarship.

IV. What are the Scholarship Criteria?

- Submit application form and letters of reference by due date
- Church Activity: be involved in at least 10 events per year at Trinity during 9th-12th grade (or in years prior to application for non high school applicants). Activity includes worship attendance, involvement in youth ministries, women's group, serving in worship, Sunday school, fellowship, etc.

IV. How are recipients notified?

Recipients will be notified by telephone and/or mail. Certificate will be presented to recipients during worship on **Sun. June 12**

V. How and when do recipients receive scholarship money?

A. Money will be awarded by Trinity Endowment Fund treasurer after recipient's successful completion of first semester of classes.
