# A Message from Pastor Mike:

"All (the apostles) were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers." Acts 1:14

Trinity's Comprehensive Ministry Review was April 22-24. A 5-member Synod Review Team (SRT) made up of clergy and lay people from nearby congregations spent the weekend with staff, council and worshippers, studying the ministry we do together. Our goal in inviting them was to have another set of eyes take a look at what we're doing, notice what we're doing well and name some things we might consider working on or changing. None of the SRT's recommendations are binding. They are to help Trinity shape its mission and ministry going forward.

I'd like to share the SRT's Affirmations and Recommendations in this space over the next few months. They studied our ministry in 14 different categories. I'll print 2-4 categories a month. Let the affirmations wash over you. We are doing many things well! Prayerfully consider the recommendations. We cannot do all of them - at least not right away. What is God's preferred future for Trinity? What do you hear God calling us to be and do? Talk about it over coffee. Listen to your neighbors. Pray. Dream.

# **Building Fund Shortfall**

### Trinity's Building Fund, which covers the cost of the Education Wing and the new metal roof on the worship and fellowship areas, is beginning to run short. So far this year we have received about half of the \$2,909 monthly mortgage payments from designated offerings plus another \$400 per month dedicated from the rent for the 4-yearold Kindergarten. That means we have been running about \$1,000 per month short, and have used up most of our reserve funds. The current mortgage balance is a bit under \$375,000. The new space has been a great tool for education, confirmation, guilting, community ministries, and much more. Please praverfully consider renewing. increasing, or beginning planned giving to Trinity's Building Fund.

### Trinity Lutheran Church Council Minutes June 6, 2016

<u>Present</u>: Kelly Browning, Rachel McHenry, Deb Henry, Mark Iverson, Darla Feyereisen, Kirk Hodnefield, Sarah Pommerening. <u>Others in attendance</u>: Betty Johnson, Lois Worbes, Harold Moll

Absent: Scott Post, Wanda Johnson, Autumn Afdahl, Marti Peterson, Pastor Mike.

Kirk called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Kirk led devotions. We discussed Called Forward Together in Christ. We decided to bring this to Sunday's worship and get input from the congregation and Sarah will put the notes together and send to the ELCA.

Secretary's Report: The May 3, 2016 Council Minutes were reviewed.

Action: Motion by Mark to approve; Deb second. Carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Rachel reported the May 31 ending balance is \$2,652.80. \$250 was sent to the Synod for Benevolence. All expenses have been paid with the exception of some outstanding items to reimburse Pastor Mike. Action: Motion by Deb to approve. Kelly Second. Carried.

<u>Building Fund Report</u>: Rachel reported the May deposit was \$5,148.00. Claire stated \$3,000 was transferred from the Mission Investment Fund. Without that transfer we would be about \$761.00 short of making the building payment for the month.

#### **Old Business**

<u>One Step & Good Neighbor Days Worship-June 5.</u> Rachel reported only about 5 Trinity families there. She brought her IPad and the card swipe, didn't get any takers to use. There were a lot of people there, the tent was pretty full. Darla heard feedback from some of the older congregation members did not like being out of their comfort zone. One Step was good. <u>Comprehensive Ministry Review Feedback</u>. What to do? Next Steps? Tabled.

Mission Teller-May 15. Not sure it was beneficial.

<u>Facility Use Form.</u> Flat fee regardless if member or not. A committee was formed to revisit and update the Facility Use Form. Darla Feyereisen, Mark Iverson, Betty Johnson and Sarah Pommerening will be meeting to propose

<u>Background Checks</u>. Sarah reported everything is in place for us to do background checks. Pastor Mike and Sarah have the authorization to initiate a background check when needed. Tabled until next month to decide when to run and where funds would come from to initiate the check.

<u>4K Price & Lease update</u>. The lease has been signed by all parties.

Normally is a 2-day event, but the event was one day and held at Trinity Lutheran in Eau Claire. Attendance doubled and were able to have corporate sponsors to cut cost down. Nothing new for ideas for Stewardship. Overall was good.

Malawi Famine Relief. Tabled until August.

<u>Council & Committee Structure</u>. Council feels this is a good idea. It should help bring new and fresh ideas. Need to check with Pastor Mike to see if he was able to meet with Pastor Keith from Zion to get more information. Synod Mission Support Report. Tabled

<u>Homeschool proposal.</u> Michelle Johnson from the Hammond Library is requesting to use Trinity on Tuesday's (8:30-1:30) and Friday's (8:30-3:30) starting this fall for some Homeschool groups. The Council discussed the proposal. Sarah relayed that Michelle would be having the homeschool parents provide paper towels, toilet paper and cleaning wipes that would be given to the church to help offset the usage. <u>Motion made by Mark Iverson, second by Kirk Hodnefield</u>: Recommend charging \$75 per day use with cleaning checklist. No classrooms will be used. Will work out 3-4 dates that work for the church. If church is not cleaned to specifications, one warning will be issued. If a second warning needs to be issued, it will cancel their facility use request. Payment for usage: plan can be worked out if they would like to pay at the end of the week or twice a month. - The SRT affirms the fact that kids are good at inviting their friends to church events.
- The SRT affirms the desire purchase an electronic sign.

# RECOMMENDATIONS

### • Hospitality and Fellowship

- The SRT recommends that you train people to intentionally and **personally invite visitors to join them for coffee.**
- The SRT recommends that you are aware of closed groups and cliques in the congregation especially at coffee time. Encourage folks to sit with people they don't know very well and to **leave a chair open for a guest around the table.**
- The SRT recommends that following worship you invite members to take the next **three minutes to talk to someone they don't know very well**. Maybe give them a conversation starter. Invite them to take just three minutes before they go and talk to their old friends, to make a new friend.
- New Members and Visitors (see trend report)
- The SRT recommends that you stop using the guest book and go to an **information pad** that is passed down the row that everyone signs. Name, email address/phone, visitor/member.
- The SRT recommends that you create a visitor information packet or sheet and consider giving a welcome gift to all visitors. Like a coffee mug filled with your favorite candies and information about worship.
- The SRT recommends you print in the bulletin or put on the screen the pastor's cell phone and invite visitors to **text the pastor their names and contact information and prayer requests**.
- The SRT recommends that **every visitor is contacted within five days** of visiting. Thank them for visiting and invite them to come back. Treat them like royalty. Every visitor is a gift from God.

### • Sharing the Good News

- The SRT recommends doing a book study on **How to Talk about Jesus (Without Freaking Out)** by Victorya Michaels Rogers and/or to invite Rev. Laurie Skow-Anderson (DEM/Asst. to the bishop, NWS) to come and lead a class/forum on this topic and provide other helpful tools for evangelism.
- The SRT recommends that periodically you have members of the congregation **share their God Sightings** with the congregation either as a part of worship and/or a newsletter article. First in New Richmond has trained its members to share God Sightings at the end of every worship service.
- The SRT recommends that every church meeting begins with conversation about **God Sightings and/or Highs and Lows** followed by prayer that lifts ups the God Sightings/ Highs and Lows. Continued practice will help members become more comfortable in talking about how they see God in their ordinary lives.
- The SRT recommends you **set a goal to grow your congregation** or AWA by 10% in the next 18 months. How will you accomplish this? What new behaviors will you use to accomplish this goal? Make a plan.
- The SRT recommends you put a "Welcome to Trinity" sign on the south side of the building. Put bulletin boards around the church with basic information about the congregation: Worship time/Sunday school time.
- The SRT recommends purchasing an electronic sign in the next 18 months.

Thank you to the Synod Review Team members, the council and other leaders who spent the weekend in conversation, and to all of you for your continued participation in this project of listening for God's leading. God bless our conversations!

### Popsicles at the Playground

Go to a playground or ball field in your neighborhood, and share refreshing freezer pops with children and adults. It's a great way to connect with your neighbors and strengthen a sense of community.

### Activity Plan Needed items: Bible, popsicles, cooler, ice

1. Pray aloud to begin:

Dear God, thank you for time to play and serve together. Help us to be a blessing to the friends, old and new, whom we will meet today. Amen.

2. Have someone read aloud <u>Hebrews 13:1-2</u> from your Bible or from the text below:

Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares.

- Talk together about the meaning of the word hospitality. Acknowledge all answers. If these meanings are not mentioned, offer them during the discussion: being friendly, helping people, making sure people feel comfortable by giving them food or beverages or fun things to do, welcoming someone new.
- 4. Take turns telling what it means to you to be part of a neighborhood or community. Name ways that people in your neighborhood practice hospitality toward one another. (For example, putting out a neighbor's trash can if they're on vacation, going to a neighbor's house after school when your parent or caregiver is running late, or checking on elderly neighbors in extreme hot or cold weather.)
- 5. Explain that your family is going to offer hospitality to people who live in your community. Tell about the location you have chosen for this activity. Practice what you will say when you offer popsicles to the parents, grandparents, or caregivers you meet. For example: "Hi! I'm [name]. We live in the neighborhood. We brought some Popsicles® to share on this hot day. Would your child like one? Would you?" If they say no, accept it graciously and go ask another person.
- 6. Discuss other questions you might ask people who seem interested in having a conversation with you. For example: How long have you lived around here? How old are your children? Where have you lived before? Do you have family nearby? What are some things you like about our community? Help children be sensitive to people's desire to talk—tell them to be pleasant and move on if anyone seems shy or uncomfortable.
- 7. Load the Popsicles® or other freezer pops into a cooler with ice or cooler freeze-packs. Bring the original packaging along in case parents want to check for allergens. Go to your chosen location. Hand out the treats and have fun playing with your neighbors!
- 8. After you return home, take a moment to talk about the experience: Did you meet anyone new? What did it feel like to serve others? How did people react to the free gift of Popsicles® on a hot day? What do we have in common with our neighbors that we didn't know about before?
- 9. Read <u>Hebrews 13:1-2</u> aloud again and pray:

Thank you, God, for the chance to show hospitality to our neighbors. Help us to keep finding ways to be friendly with our neighbors and to share your love. Amen.
