5 INSIGHTS ABOUT THE UNCHURCHED THAT MIGHT SURPRISE YOU

Recently, I read one of the most comprehensive studies ever done on the unchurched by Life Way Research. I offer these insight points for each of us to consider how we at Trinity Church can reach out to invite the unchurched to experience Christ's love and grace at Trinity. His report defined "unchurched" as someone who has not attended a worship service in the last 6 months.

- 1. Most have some church background.** Almost 2/3 of them (62%) went to church regularly as child.
- 2. Most quit Church because they got out of the habit of going.** Some left the church for negative reasons, but that is not true of the majority.



- 3. One-third have plans to go back to church in the future.** Please read this statement carefully. One of 3 unchurched Americans are actually planning to return to church! Are we at Trinity actively inviting them?

4. The unchurched are very open to a gospel conversation. 47% would interact freely in such a conversation. 31% would listen actively without participating. WOW! Almost 8 of 10 unchurched Americans would welcome a gospel conversation. No longer can we use the poor excuse that the unchurched aren't interested in gospel conversations. In reality, church members are more likely not to be interested in initiating gospel conversations.

5. If you invite them, they will come. Among the unchurched 55% said they would attend church if they were invited by a family member. 51% said they would attend church if invited by a friend or family member. These numbers are staggering and tell me the opportunities are incredible.

"IN HAMMOND FOR HAMMOND" is our new mission statement. How ready are we to seize this God-given moment? See YOU and YOUR GUEST in worship! Invite them to stay for coffee and introduce them to others.

Hello Families –

We kicked off BOLT on Wednesday September 13th with a BBQ. I would like to thank all of the families who attended, it was a great night. The BOLT guides are looking forward to working with your children in their faith journeys these next nine months.

I want to share with you what BOLT stands for and what we hope to accomplish this year. BOLT at Trinity stands for, Building Our Love and Talents, so in this new education program we will use curriculum that provides hands-on activity that connects to the Bible story, we will have great discussions for every age, they will learn creative Bible memory techniques, and have take-home reviews of the lesson to connect kids with their families at home. We will be teaching both faith and life skills. Our kids will be transformed in the next nine months and be Super-Charged for Life. Our first lesson will be Who Is God and it will be a great reminder for the kids to live a life of trust.


