October 9, 2017

7:07pm Meeting Called to Order by Marti Peterson.

Absent were: Scott Post, Kelly Browning and Mark Iverson

Welcome Guest/Open Forum-Public Comment: Ron Pratt asked Tim Haugen how much the television was used in the Education Wing. Discussion about needing to replace the television from the Sanctuary, as the parts are no longer available and we borrowed the TV from the Education Wing to use in the Sanctuary. Ron was going to also talk with Pastor Ralph to see how much the television would be used if replaced.

Approve Minutes from September 11, 2017: Motion to approve by Deb Henry, Lois Worbes second. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report: Rachel reported \$16,478.21 in the general fund. September's offering was up by \$2,218.54. Rachel is concerned about her role as Treasurer on the Council. Voting vs. non-voting. Lois Worbes is on the Constitution/Bylaws committee, she said the team is working hard to clarify positions and as of now the Treasurer position is a non-voting position. - 2. **Mission & Human Needs: Donations update:** Marti Peterson reported that an email was sent out before Food Shelf Sunday to bring Food items. The response was great! Marti brought a basket of items to Grace Place and they were very Thankful

My goal is to make JV freshman year. I also love hiking. I would go hiking everyday if I could. While the 8th graders went to Washington D.C., we went to Mount Vernon. It felt like heaven to me. It was huge and had trails leading to different areas of his estate. I always try to tell myself that I can do something and limit the world can't. My volleyball coaches told me the word "can't" isn't in our vocabulary. I also love dogs and I wish I could save every one of them; I would do the same with elephants.


