Absent were: Darla Feyereisen, Kelly Browning and Lois Worbes.

Welcome Guest/Open Forum-Public Comment: Claire and Audrey Severson from Our Savior's in Beldenville came to talk about Luther Point Bible Camp and thank us for supporting the camp and asked us to continue to support Luther Point. Audrey explained that Luther Point is welcome to all people. They left a brochure and some pricing sheet.

Approve Minutes from October 9, 2017: no quorum to approve.

- **Treasurer Report:** Rachel reported she is working on condensing accounts one account at a time. She is also working on the budget for 2018. Kolby Hodnefield's Faith Statement

Good Morning,

I have been invited up here before you to share my statement of faith. Here is the thing, faith is tricky, and for most it's something we grow up with. It's a seed planted in our lives. But God is always there; just like how the sun is always there. In this journey, I have constantly been reminded that we don't have all the answers.
