

We prayed for her and every time we could we would see her. When she started losing her hair it made me sad that she would have to lose her hair. I had always known her either hair so it would be different for me. Of course, I would still love her the same but she would lose that part of her. Once her hair was fully gone she started to ear beanies. After a while, it became normal and we thought nothing of it. Whenever I would talk about it with someone I would feel that pain again. I hated that feeling because it reminded me that she has something terrible that could take her from us. After knowing and felling all of this pain we were finally shown a light. Since they found that she had cancer pretty early she got better and the cancer got smaller. She is still doing treatment but she is doing so much better than she was. I thanked God so much after finding out. And that was one of the times I saw my faith.

Trinity Council Minutes for January 8th, 2018

7:09pm Meeting Called to Order by Marti Peterson.

Present are: Deb Henry, Betty Johnson, Pastor Ralph Olsen, Sue Frank, Office Secretary Sarah Pommerening, Treasurer Rachel McHenry, Interim President Marti Peterson, Kathy Jensen, Tim Haugen (in for Kelly Browning) and Visitor Rose Kuebker.

Absent were: Mark Iverson and Kelly Browning.

Welcome Guest/Open Forum-Public Comment: No comments.

Approve Minutes from December 11, 2017: Motion made by Deb Henry to approve the December Council minutes. Second by Sue Frank. **Motion carried.**

Treasurer Report: Rachel reported shared with the Council a copy of the 2018 budget and ask for people to look over and let her know if they see any errors or have any questions. The Building Fund has been moved into the General Fund. The Fellowship, Mission & Human Needs accounts will be closed this year and moved into the General Fund also. Tellering will still be the same process as the Building Fund will still be separate from the General Fund. Discussion on the money from stocks that have been sold. 1. Capital Campaign- which would require a 3-year commitment. 2. Refinance- the interest rate would be 3.875%, it would add 5 years to the mortgage and the payment would be \$1,900 vs. \$2,600. 3. Use the stock money to help pay the mortgage. More discussion needed on the how to tackle the building fund money. Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report by Deb Henry. Second by Betty Johnson. **Motion carried.**

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ralph reported that five people met about the Bylaws & Constitution. Their recommendation is to have two Annual meetings. One in January to discuss the financials and approve the budget and a second one to vote in new Council Representatives. The team is recommending this so that the snowbirds are able to have input.

Discussion about the Constitution and Bylaws: Pastor Ralph made it very clear that nominating Committee reported back to him that the Council is not following items that are covered in the Constitution and bylaws.

The Council needed to act on these items immediately. Mutual Ministry team needs to be formed. Also, there was discussion about Offering Tellers. Pastor Ralph read in the Bylaws that the Financial Secretary & Office Secretary are to count the offering together within 48 hours of being collected. If one of them is not available, then a substitute would be found to take their place.

We need to appoint a Transition Team. There should be five individuals on this team. The Council members are to bring names to the February Council meeting, so we are able to get this team established and keep going forward with the Call Process.

Pastor Ralph is going to step back from being at all the committee meetings and focus on visiting members who are homebound or in nursing home. He will be meeting with the Nominating Committee next Wednesday to finalize for the Annual meeting.

Pastor Ralph will be meeting with Pastor Durk Peterson from Cross and Pastor Paul Backstrom from Gethsemane this Wednesday to discuss the possibility of the three churches holding a Good Friday event geared for children. More details to come.

Nominating Committee-update: Pastor Ralph met with Vera Grant, Chris & Judy Larson to talk about people and see what input they have in finding people to replace those leaving on the Council. They will be meeting again next week.

Scheduling of events for next year: Revisit in February

• 2018 Budget- Covered in Treasurer's report. The Constitution/Bylaw team is proposing 2 annual meetings. January for the budget and later in the year for committee members. Then those who are snowbirds would have input as well.
