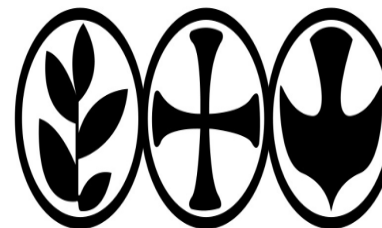

Blood Donors Needed!



Trinity is hosting a Red Cross Blood Drive this Friday, July 12th from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. You may set up an appointment by calling 1-800-733-2767, the Red Cross line, or online at redcrossblood.org and entering "Hammond" in the search bar.

I have been an active blood donor my whole life. I follow in the footsteps of my parents in giving blood. It was one of the ways they were active in their community for the sake of the common good. Once I began giving, I learned my blood type, O negative. I am a universal donor, meaning my blood can be used by anyone, no matter their type. That is great! The flip side is that if I need a blood transfusion, I can only receive my type, O negative. That is not good, because about 3% of the population currently donates blood, and the supply of blood for the Red Cross and other organizations is very low. It has been low for over a year.

I am glad football star Peyton Manning is now an ambassador encouraging people to give blood. Other voices are needed to encourage people to give blood, especially when they are young and healthy. Will your employer give you time to give blood? It is faster than ever if you fill out the Rapid Pass before you go to the donation site. Are you able to give blood? Can you encourage someone you know to give blood? It is one simple way to serve in this life. It is one way to show love for your neighbor in need. - Pastor Julie

The congregation won a Bright Spot Award at the NW Synod of WI Assembly for the courage to have this dialogue and make this change.
