

The ImPossible Promise of Enough



Just over 50 years ago a group of people came together with a vision of forming a congregation in Hamond. Trinity is the result of that congregation. Early on the people who gathered got excited about what they could do together. The first sanctuary the people of Trinity built is the space now used for fellowship and meals. Everything happened in that room! The charter members can tell you how they would set up the space for worship, then at the end of worship, they would tear that down and create space for Sunday School rooms with dividers. Those who drank coffee were often found standing in the kitchen. Their excitement translated into financial gifts and commitment, sharing of talents, the use of sweat and hustle, and the giving of their time for the community of Trinity.

Today's Bible reading from Exodus chapters 35 and 36 is a story rich in detail of how the Hebrew people found they had an endless supply of resources when Moses told them about God's vision to build a temporary worship space, a tabernacle. The story tells how the hearts of the people were stirred, how "everyone who could make an offering" of what was needed did, and how "everyone whose spirit was willing" eagerly brought their offerings.
