All Saints Sunday

All Saints's Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. It began as a time to commemorate the martyrs and heroic figures who had died while defending the faith. Those whose lives were examples of nonviolent witness were considered especially holy. It has since become a day when we honor and remember those who, in death, have joined the Church Triumphant, as well as the faithful saints of the present who serve Jesus Christ. The whole company of saints includes those of the past, the present, and the future.

Martin Luther taught that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint, *simul justus et peccator*, that is, a sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus. Seeing through a Lutheran lens, we celebrate not only those who lived exemplary lives, but all who have been baptized into Christ's death.

Today, by reading their names, tolling a bell and lighting a candle for each, we remember those of our congregation who have died during the past year. We remember Kathy Gustafson and Oliver Case. Afterward, there will be an opportunity for anyone in the congregation to come forward to light a candle in memory of someone dear to them.
