Learning about Holy Communion

Pastor Julie will be leading BOLT for a few weeks beginning January 19th and introducing the teachings of Dan Erlander, *A Place for You*. These weeks will teach the children about Holy Communion. The first session on January 19th at 10:15 a.m. will focus on how Holy Communion is all about God's love. God's love is a love that became human to dwell among us (John 1:14). It is a love that brings good news to all, especially to the hungry and the poor (Luke 4:18). It is a love that gives itself away for the life of the world and calls us to do the same (John 15:12-13). Through Christ, the love of God reaches into every corner of our lives, breaking down the wall of hostility (Ephesians 2:14) and knitting us together in one communion.

Every family will receive a beautifully illustrated Holy Communion Book so parents have a resource to review when their child asks questions. We learn as we experience the sacrament. Families are free to choose when their child is ready to take Holy Communion. Communion is one of the three means of grace. That is, it is one of the three main ways God offers himself to us and for us. The others are in the sacrament of Holy Baptism and through the Word of God.

Youth volunteers are needed to help as usual. Parents are encouraged to accompany their children for this time of experiential learning. All BOLT kids may participate in

these sessions whether they are already receiving Holy Communion or have yet to take the sacrament. BOLT resumes on Sunday, January 19 th, 10:15 – 11:00 a.m.
