The podcast has turned the page into the New Testament! Find all the podcasts at www.enterthebible.org. The next installment is a podcast on the book of [ACTS](#). Dr. F. Scott Spencer traces the gospel's expansion from Jerusalem to Rome using the geographic outline in [Acts 1:8](#), and describes the book as a historical narrative of faith. The conversation also explores the meaning of "the Way," and reflects on how the Book of Acts shaped his own faith during 2020. He closes with a seven word summary of Acts: "Amazing journey of God's free spirit." Listeners will come away with a renewed sense of how this book speaks to openness, growth, and the movement of the Spirit today.
