ELCA's Faith and Civic Life Statement—Free Zoom series from Synod

The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin is providing a series of online discussions on the topic of how Christians are called to engage as citizens in their communities and nation. Using the ELCA's newest social statement adopted at the 2025 Assembly, we will explore the relationship between church and government, what is Christian Nationalism, and the need for constructive engagement in an age of hyperpartisan polarization. The series is on the next 5 Monday nights at 6:30 p.m. When you register you will get a Zoom link to join. They expressed gratitude for Trinity's help these past many months of using our facility to serve the community.

The Bible in One Year

Find all the podcasts at www.enterthebible.org. The next installment is a podcast on the book of [Romans](#). Dr. Jenny Pietz, Associate Professor of New Testament at Luther Seminary will explore justification by faith in Romans. Dr. Pietz walks through how Paul's core message of the gospel unites Jews and Gentiles as one body in Christ. The conversation also touches on Paul's likely reasons for writing to a church he had never visited, and how his own life and eventual martyrdom underscore the stakes of the gospel he proclaimed.

The discussion moves through some of Romans' most memorable passages, including chapter 8's assurance that nothing can separate believers from the love of God, and Romans 12's call to be transformed by the renewing of the mind. Dr. Pietz also highlights the influence of Romans on Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, and points to women named in the letter — including Phoebe and Junia — as early evidence of women in gospel ministry. Whether you are new to Paul's letters or returning to Romans again, this episode offers a rich, accessible entry point into one of the most theologically significant books in the New Testament.
