The Bible in One Year

The podcast has turned the page into the New Testament! Find all the podcasts at www.enterthebible.org. The next installment is a podcast on the book of [LUKE](#). Dr. Matt Skinner explores what makes Luke unique, like that he describes Jesus birth in the beginning and Jesus’ ascension at the end. Dr. Skinner is Professor of New Testament at Luther Seminary. Luke is also unique in that it has a follow-up book, Acts. The author of Luke is responsible for 1/4 of the New Testament. The gospel of Luke pays a bit more attention to the poor and disenfranchised than the other gospels. Luke is attentive to the whole society. Spiritual Practice: The Star Word of the Week is “friend.” The Apostle Paul wrote his letters before the gospels were put together but we think he heard the stories that were told that ended up being recorded in the four gospels we read today. The lectionary reading of Romans 13 for this week contains the summary of all the commandments which the four gospels attribute to Jesus. “Love your neighbor as yourself. Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law,” Romans 13:9-10. Growing up I thought of my neighbor as those who lived in close proximity to me on the farm. I often associated the neighbor with a friend. After years of study of the scripture and preaching on the word, it is clear to me that associating a neighbor as a friend is good. Now also think of the neighbor as any or all of the human beings on the planet, and consider being a friend to any or all of them. We can only do this because of the gift of love first given to us from God. Think about two people, one it would be easy to befriend, and another it would cost you something to befriend. Then begin to take steps acting as a friend to each.
